

Leadership and the Energiewende:
German Leadership by Diffusion
Karoline Steinbacher (bio) and Michael Pahle* (bio)

Abstract

The German energy transition—or *Energiewende*—stands out globally as one of the most prominent and widely discussed plans to transform an energy system. However, the ways in which Germany can and does promote the diffusion of its model remain to be systematically reviewed. Aiming at closing this gap, this article develops an analytical framework for “leadership by diffusion” and applies it to the Energiewende. We find that, while Germany’s aim of gaining followers has led to it becoming a highly active leader, a comprehensive strategy for effective leadership is still to emerge. Tapping the full potential of Energiewende leadership will require bundling existing initiatives and strengthening the availability of information on this transformation in the making. At the domestic level, the implementation of the Energiewende in Germany will need to consider the policy model’s abilities to trigger innovation and generate knowledge and lessons that can facilitate policy action elsewhere.

The architecture of global climate governance after the December 2015 Paris Agreement has emphasized the role of policy action at the national level in a polycentric climate regime. Studying and understanding the international dimension of national policy models is therefore of the utmost relevance, in particular given the propensity for states to adopt climate policies when others do so as well, making diffusion a relevant mechanism in global climate protection efforts (Fankhauser et al. 2016).

This being said, the rationality of unilateral action for climate protection without multilateral agreements has been questioned, given the associated risk of a free-rider dilemma (Hoel 1991; Weimann 2012). Several mechanisms have been identified to explain how unilateral action can nevertheless contribute to the solution of global problems by facilitating action in other countries (Andresen and Agrawala 2002; [End Page 70] Edenhofer et al. 2013; Schwerhoff 2013). These include reducing policy uncertainty, cost, and information asymmetries for potential “followers”; pushing standards of federal and supranational legislation upward (Vogel 1997); signaling (Brandt 2004); and creating norms that followers may emulate (Börzel and Risse 2009; Dolowitz and Marsh 2000; Heinze 2011). All of these mechanisms can be facilitated by policy diffusion—the traveling of policies and ideas across borders.

There is ongoing debate in the literature on the differences and commonalities between policy *transfer* and policy *diffusion*, which are both in turn based on submechanisms such as learning, emulation, lesson drawing, mimicry, coercion, or conditionality (Dolowitz and Marsh 2000; Heinze 2011; Marsh and Sharman 2009). A common understanding is that the term “diffusion” covers the general phenomenon of policies, ideas, institutions, or







Secondary sources are a great place to begin your research. Although the primary sources of law--case law, statutes, and regulations--establish the law on a given topic, it is often difficult to quickly locate answers in them. Secondary sources often explain legal principles more thoroughly than a single case or statute, so using them can help you save time. Secondary sources also help you avoid unnecessary research, since you're tapping into work that someone else has already done on an issue.



Legislative History is the official documentary record of the passage of a proposed statute - often involving multiple bills or resolutions - through the successive stages of the legislative process. At the federal level of government this process formally commences with the introduction of a measure in Congress by a Senator or Representative and unless terminating short of enactment, the most common outcome, concludes with a Presidential signing into law or veto. For major initiatives, however, the documentary record frequently begins before the introduction of a bill, perhaps with a background Congressional investigative study or committee hearing from a previous Congress or a draft of proposed legislation by the President.



Most people know that the [HeinOnline subscription database](#) is a great source of legal research materials from all over the world. HeinOnline's collection of legal primary and secondary sources from Canada is especially strong, and it is growing all the time.

In addition to the [Canada Supreme Court Reports](#) (date coverage: 1876-2016) and the [Revised Statutes of Canada](#) (all six revisions, from 1886 through 1985), Hein recently added a new library: [Provincial Statutes of Canada](#).

Hein describes this new library as follows:

"The Provincial Statutes of Canada contain public and private acts passed by Canadian provincial governments. Current, revised, and historical content is available for Alberta, British Columbia, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Ontario. Historical and revised content only is available for Manitoba, Newfoundland and Labrador, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, and Saskatchewan."

HeinOnline also has a collection of more than 100 Canadian law journals. To access this collection from the HeinOnline homepage, click [Law Journal Library > Country > Canada](#).

In addition to HeinOnline, the Law Library also subscribes to [QuickLaw: LexisNexis Canada](#). This source provides access to Canadian court cases, legislation, journal articles, commentary, and more.
